

AKIHABARA 秋葉原

AKIHABARA is a name that's even becoming famous in the United States. Say "Akihabara" and one thing comes to mind: electronics. You'll find all the latest, all the finest Japanese electronic gear, from tiny walkie-talkies and wrist-watch calculators to giant sound systems, 50-inch TV's and home computer layouts. Located to the west of Akihabara Station on the Yamanote Line are block after block of stores, from eight-story electronic department stores to tiny arcade shops barely big enough for the owner to stand in. Two of the biggest stores are Yamagiwa Denki and Rajio Sentaa (Radio Center). If you like electronics, you'll go crazy at Akihabara.

HOW TO GET THERE


From Yokosuka Chuo:

1. Go to YOKOSUKA CHUO 横須賀中央 Station and buy a ¥780 transfer ticket for AKIHABARA 秋葉原 Station on JR YAMANOTE JR 山手線 Line.
2. Go to track #2 and take the GREEN or RED KANJI train to SHINAGAWA 品川 Station.
3. Get off at SHINAGAWA 品川 and transfer to JR YAMANOTE JR 山手線 Line bound for Tokyo/Ueno on track #1. AKIHABARA is the 7th stop from Shinagawa.
4. Get off at AKIHABARA 秋葉原 Station. From the train platform, go down the steps and leave the station using the WEST exit (Nishi-guchi). After passing through the wicket on the ground floor, you can leave the station from the left or the right side. The main street will be two blocks away.

From Ikego:

1. Go to JIMMUJI (神武寺) Station and buy a ¥ 710 transfer ticket for AKIHABARA Station on JR YAMANOTE Line.
2. Take a train from track #2 to KANAZAWA BUNKO 金沢文庫 and change to a GREEN or RED KANJI train to SHINAGAWA.
3. **Continue as above #3.**

{Note: During certain times of the day it may be necessary to switch trains at KANAZAWA HAKKEI 金沢八景.
